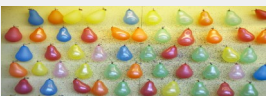
## KINDERGARTEN HAPPENINGS

## FIRST GRADE HAPPENINGS

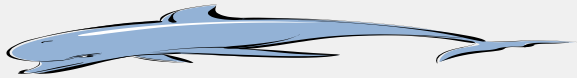
